# The Future of Urban Living Post Pandemic Consultation Programme Agenda

### **Consultation Design**

The consultation programme has been designed with several principles in mind:

- **Maximize collaborative working time**. The consultation has been designed to maximize the time for participants to work closely with each other in small break out groups. This will facilitate optimal information exchange and network experience.
- Harnessing Collective Insight. The participants are experts in each of the topic areas. The design of the programme has aimed to harness the collective intelligence and experience of the participants in order to produce new insights and perspectives about the future of urban living in the new post pandemic context. This will build off the insights from the January 2021 consultation, focusing on **solutions** that cities can embrace. *Please refer to the accompanying Background paper for more details on the January 2021 consultation*.

#### Organisation of Consultation

In designing the Consultation, the aim has been to:

- Bring together 20 25 invited global experts. The consultation guests are from key areas such as climate change, energy, food, smart cities, agriculture, urban planning, architecture, transportation, sociology and work. These individuals bring recognised expertise to the discussion but, equally importantly, a clear sense of the relationship between their expertise and the future of urban living especially in a post pandemic world. Participants who will be attending may have or have not attended the previous consultations.
- Review the outcomes from the previous virtual Future of Urban Living Post Pandemic consultation, held in January 2021. The January virtual consultation aimed to explore the outcomes from the in-person Future of Urban Living Consultation held in December 2019, in light of the global Covid-19 pandemic. There are clear signs that the pandemic is beginning to lift. Building on the work carried out in January, Future iQ and St George's House want to take this opportunity to look in more depth at the **solutions** that cities must embrace in a post pandemic world.
- Understand the complexity of the topic. This consultation process will outline the complex and interrelated forces that are combining to shape the future of urban living in 2050 and the potential **solutions** that cities must embrace in a post pandemic world.
